Have you ever wondered why most churches in the Church of England call the communion service held on December 24th Midnight Mass?

Normally when Anglicans share the bread and wine we typically call it "Holy Communion" or "The Eucharist," while the Roman Catholics use the word "Mass."

History and habit explain why Anglicans still use the name Midnight Mass, because you can't separate the Mass from Christmas.

Some nine hundred to a thousand years ago the English began to shorten the words for the annual festival "Christ's Mass" or "Cristes-messe" to Christmas. [As an aside the abbreviation Xmas began in the Middle Ages, the first letter of the based on the initial letter chi (X) in the Greek Χριστός (Christ)].

At its root Christmas is about communion, coming close to God and one another. Connecting with God and with each another is at the heart of Christmas.

We prepare ourselves for Christmas with a four-week Church season called Advent, a name which comes from the Latin word for 'Coming." This year Advent begins on Sunday 30 November. For several years the Church of England has promoted this season of preparation and encouraged the public to attend their local church at Christmas using publicity material around the theme of "Follow the Star."

This year we have a new theme based on the idea of sharing the joy of Christmas and connecting with one another. The theme of joy springs from the Bible passage when an angel of the Lord appeared to the shepherds keeping watch over their flock by night with the message "I am bringing you good news of great joy for all the people." This year's theme highlights not only the joy of the birth of Emmanuel, which means "God with us", but also the joy of connecting with one another.

Of course Christmas can be for some people a challenging time for those who are not feeling particularly joyful, which is why this year St Mary's Church is holding its first "Blue Christmas Service. For more about that see page 4

There are many examples of joy and connecting in the nativity story. Fearful and confused by the message from the Angel Gabriel, Mary visited her cousin Elizabeth, whose own baby leaped with joy inside her when the two women saw each other. Elizabeth connected with Mary by praying a blessing over her. Mary in response sang a song of great joy about the saviour coming to feed the hungry and raise up the lowly.

After the shepherds visited the newborn Christ, they left praising God and revelled in the joy of sharing all they heard and seen.

And several years later when the star stopped over the place where Mary, Joseph and Jesus were living, the wise men were "overwhelmed with joy."

I look forward to sharing the joy of Christmas with you at your parish church this year.

#### **Blue Christmas**

This year the Church of England in its promotional resources for Advent and Christmas is focusing on Joy.

But for those who are grieving, ill, lonely or struggling for any reason may find it challenging when they see everyone in party mode. Not everyone connects with adverts on the television like Sainsbury's Big Friendly Giant or Asda's Grinch.

In my own case my wife, Theresa, suddenly died on 22 December last year and so for me and my family there will be sadness amid the joy.

This year for the first time St Mary's Church is holding a "Blue Christmas Service" at 3.00pm on Saturday 20 December.

This will be a gentle service of readings, prayers, music and candle-lighting. There might be a calm Christmas carol or two but there won't be enforced jollity with bouncy carols, Christmas jumpers and reindeer antlers bobbing on our heads.

A Blue Christmas service acknowledges pain in dark times but also speaks of the light that Christ brings. Our faith doesn't gloss over pain, but we practice and believe in God's presence beside us in our pain.

We hope you can join us. It sometimes helps to share our pain and find strength in quiet solidarity.

#### **Our Charity Collections This Christmas**

This year our collections at our Blue Christmas Service, Family Christmas Carol Service, Nativity (Crib) Services, Midnight Mass and Christmas Day Communion will be on behalf of Garden House Hospice Care.

Nearly 40 years ago, Garden House Hospice Care was founded by our community to meet a vital need: expert palliative and end of life care for local people. Since then, they've supported thousands of patients and families - caring for and empowering them to live well so they can spend precious time together, and, when the moment comes, ensure comfort and dignity in their final days.

Four decades later, the need has never been greater, but their future has never been more uncertain.

They are facing a funding shortfall of £1.178 million this year having already taken action to reduce what they can control, cutting £1,035,000 in expenditure. But with National Insurance costs up by over £200,000, utility and food bills doubling, medication costs soaring with no NHS funding for medicines, and a decline in charitable income they are still left with a £750,000 gap before the end of the financial year. Next year, the shortfall is projected to grow to at least £1.1 million .

The impact is already being felt having been forced to reduce the number of beds on their Inpatient Unit from 12 to 8, scale back a third of their community services, and delay essential property repairs and maintenance. They now have a waiting list of people in urgent need of care who they cannot guarantee to support.

Under the current financial model, hospices like theirs receive only around 29% of their funding from the NHS. The remaining 71% relies on charitable giving - a model that no longer meets their growing demand.

They cannot continue in this way and be able to deliver their outstanding care to the patients of today and the patients of tomorrow which is why they are our Church's Charity of Choice this Christmastime.

#### Who was the Real Virgin?

#### Santa's sleigh

Father Christmas nervously went for his sleigh-driving test. He came rushing back in a thunder of reindeer and pulled up in front of the toy factory. "At last!" he shouted, "No-el plates!"

#### What is Christingle?

Christingle is a joyful celebration that brings families and communities together to share the light of Jesus and spread a message of hope. Christingle celebrations are named after the Christingles that are lit during the ceremony.





Christingles are oranges wrapped in red tape, decorated with dried fruit and sweets, with a candle on top. During the service, each person takes a Christingle, and the candles are lit to create a warm, magical glow symbolising the light of Christ and bringing hope to people living in darkness.

Christingles are made using oranges, ribbon, sweets, dried fruit and a candle. Each of these elements has a special meaning and helps to tell the Christian story:

The orange represents the world

The red ribbon (or tape) symbolises the love and blood of Christ

The sweets and dried fruit represent all of God's creation

The lit candle represents Jesus' light in the world, bringing hope to people living in darkness.

Christingle celebrations have been taking place for over 50 years. The first Christingle service in this country took place at Lincoln Cathedral in 1968, but Christingles themselves go back much further, to the Moravian church in Germany. At a children's service in Marienborn in 1747, Bishop Johannes de Watteville looked for a simple way to explain the happiness that had come to people through Jesus and he created a symbol – the Christingle – to do this.

All the money raised at our Christingle Services will support The Children's Society. Who fight for hope by deeply understanding the needs of young people and by supporting them through their most serious life challenges. They work with young people who have suffered years of abuse, who have run away from home or are struggling with mental health issues. They look out for young carers and those who are at risk of being groomed by criminal groups and help refugees who have no one else to turn to in this country.

The Christingle service at St Mary's Church, this year is on Sunday 14<sup>th</sup> December at 4pm and if you would like a collection box to have at home prior to the service so that you can bring your offering to the service you can pick one up from the church. They are on the shelf by the north door which is on the side by the car park.

We look forward to seeing many of you on the day.

#### **Baptisms**



We have celebrated many baptisms (christenings) in Stotfold through 2025, with a number of local families or families with a link to St Mary the Virgin church. Baptism services are always joyful events, often welcoming a whole host of young families and children. We try to involve brothers and sisters of the child to be baptised in the service, often engaging them to help fill the font with water. The font in St Mary's church has been used to baptise many generations of Stotfold families and is thought to date from either the 14<sup>th</sup> or 15<sup>th</sup> century. It was moved, in 2018, to the south aisle so now we can gather everyone in a baptism service around the font

#### Gas and Electricity for our Church and Church Hall

Until the end of September 2027 as part of our commitment to being good stewards of the environment we have contracted to purchasing electricity that is 100% generated from renewable sources and Voluntary Carbon Offset gas where the additional cost to the brown gas that we use goes into a fund to plant trees to offset the carbon load.

#### **All About Christmas Trees**

**How many are sold each year?** According to recent figures, about five million real Christmas trees are sold in the UK each year.

**How old are they?** Your typical Christmas tree of six to seven feet is between ten and 12 years old.

**How are they grown?** Seed is collected from trees either in the wild or in specially selected seed orchards. It is sown in a nursery, where the seedlings then grow for three to four years. The young plants are then planted by a grower and grown on for a further seven to nine years. While they are growing, the grower will fertilise, shape and prune the tree many times each year.

#### What are the different types of Christmas trees? Here are just some...

Nordmann Fir – the most popular Christmas tree in the UK. Much loved for its symmetry, strong branches and excellent needle retention. The lush, dark green needles provide great background for displaying ornaments.

Fraser Fir – the tree with the wonderful fragrance. Pyramid-shaped, it has strong branches with dark green, needles that are silvery underneath.

Noble Fir – A bluish-green tree with short, stiff branches ideal for heavier ornaments. A fresh fragrance, and great needle retention.

Douglas Fir – Very popular in the USA, with a great shape, and probably the strongest scent of all Christmas trees. Only problem – harder to decorate as usually very dense branches.

Norway Spruce – A dark green conical shaped tree with a strong fragrance. Needs to be well-watered for good needle retention.

Blue Spruce – This is ideal for your small or second tree. It's beautiful, unique blue colouring and good stiff branches are great for showing off heavy decorations. Needs watering well.

Lodgepole Pine – Beautiful tapered branches with green/yellow needles. A tree loved by traditionalists.

The British Christmas Tree Growers Association (BCTGA) estimates that approximately 75% of the trees sold in the UK consist of Nordmann Fir, with the remaining portion comprising Norway Spruce, Fraser Fir, and a selection of other less prevalent species

The BCTGA urges people to buy a British grown tree to support the local economy, agriculture and the environment. Buying British means money is going directly back into the country's economy and helping provide employment in the agricultural sector.

A natural two-metre Christmas tree without roots, disposed of burning on a bonfire, planting it or having it chipped to spread on a garden, will have a carbon footprint of around 3.5kg of CO2. A two-metre Christmas tree made from plastic has a carbon footprint of around 40kg of CO2.

A huge thank you to E H Crouch Funeral Director's who for so many years now have so very kindly donated our real Christmas Tree for everyone to enjoy over the Advent and Christmas period.



For those of you who are not aware the central trunk then forms the basis each year of our Easter Cross and the crosspiece will have come from either the vicarage or from one of our congregation.

Even before the time of Christ, evergreen trees were seen in winter as a symbol of fertility.

It was the 16<sup>th</sup> century monk, Martin Luther, who is credited with the idea of having lights on Christmas trees. He added candles to his tree, to look like stars in a forest.

It was Woolworths who first sold manufactured Christmas tree ornaments – back in 1880.


In a survey of the nation's favourite smells, real Christmas trees came eighth, just behind the sea, but ahead of perfume.



On the 3rd Sunday in December which is 21 December there will only be one service which will be a 10am Communion Service.


